

Knoxville and Ads Are Rained Out; Will Play Double-Bill Today

The Knoxville and New Orleans teams were well on their way in a hard fought contest when rain interrupted them during the fourth inning. The score was 1 and 1 and there seemed little to choose between them.

Moffet was pitching for the Caulfields and L. Moore for the visiting negroes. The feature play of the fractional game was made by "Wing" Maddox, the one-armed outfielder-pitcher who is one of the most remarkable players in baseball. The Knoxville catcher had thrown wide to second base trying to catch a runner, who continued on toward third. Maddox ran up behind second, caught the ball on the first bound, dropped his glove and then threw the runner out at third by ten feet.

Knoxville is leading the race and appears to be the strongest negro team that has played here. Four games are to be played, a double-header being scheduled for today at 2 o'clock to make up for failure to make out a complete game yesterday. "Steel Arm" Dickie, the pitcher, who won 25 straight games, will pitch for Knoxville Saturday.
