

GLASS PITCHES MEMPHIS TO WIN OVER SAINTS, BUT MOUND CITY BOYS TAKE 3 FOR THEMSELVES

Memphis, Tenn., Aug. 2.—
The Memphis Red Sox won
“hands down” from the St.
Louis Stars behind the mas-
terly pitching of
Carl Glass, star
southpaw of the
locals.

Glass gave up
only four meas-
ly bingles. Be-
sides pitching a
great game,
Glass made a
sensational
bare-handed
catch of a hot
grounder by H. Williams in the
second stanza.

Another feature was the
fielding duel between Wells,
shortstop for the Stars, and
Owens, shortstop for the Red
Sox.

Both turned in fancy plays and it
is hard to tell which of the two had
the edge—if there was one. Wells was
a thorn in the side of the Sox and
stopped them at all turns. Owens
made three consecutive assists in the
ninth inning to climax a perfect day
afield.

The Stars drew first blood in the
second when they scored one marker
on a single by Suttles, who went to
second when Brown made a low throw
to catch him off first. He scored on
a scorching bingle by Creacy to the
middle garden.

The Sox came back in their half
of the second and knotted the count
at one all when Rogers, first up,
stroled to the first satchel, moved
down to second on a sacrifice by
Owens. He scored from second a mo-
ment later when Green singled. The
Red Sox scored two more runs in the
fifth and the scoring ended.

Memphis, Aug. 3.—The St. Louis
Stars defeated the Red Sox, 6 to 5.

The two teams alternated in the
lead of total scores throughout the
game and the Stars finally emerged
victorious. The game was a free hit-
ting contest, but the hits of neither
side were bunched, therefore keeping
down a larger score.

Rogers, the Sox leftfielder, hit the
signboard in right field and pulled
up at third. His hit scored two men
ahead of him. Suttles, St. Louis
first sacker, secured four hits out of
five trips to the plate.

His heavy stick work was a big
help to St. Louis. Green of the Red
Sox got three hits out of four at-
tempts, and McHaskell, Sox first
sacker, garnered three safeties in six
times at bat.

Memphis, Aug. 4.—The St. Louis
Stars took both halves of Sunday's
twin bill from the Memphis Red Sox
by the scores of 4 to 0 and 3 to 0.

In the initial tilt Hensley, St. Louis
right-hander, with the unwavering
support of his teammates, held the
locals to a lone hit, a single to cen-
ter by Rogers in the eighth. Only
29 men faced him throughout the
game. St. Louis opened the fire-
works in the first frame when Wells
and Suttles coupled with a pass to B.
Russell that resulted in a run. The
visitors came back in the third and
scored one tally when they mixed
two hits with an error. St. Louis
hung up another marker in the fifth
when Bell scored on a Memphis mis-
cue. In the sixth the invaders crossed
the plate again when Redus scored on
J. Russell's single to center.

The game was also featured by the
fielding of Green, Redus and Wells.

In the second encounter the Stars
jumped in front when successive
singles by B. Russell and Wells, fol-
lowed by a double by Redue, resulted
in a pair of scores.

The game then turned into a pitch-
ing duel between Dean and Davis un-
til the fifth when a free ticket to B.
Russell and singles by Bell and Wells
accounted for a run.

The fielding of Owens, McHaskell
and J. Russell was brilliant.
