

# MEMPHIS RED SOX LEAD IN SERIES WITH NASHVILLE ELITES

Memphis, Tenn., July 13.—The Memphis Red Sox drove out 18 hits to win, 10 to 4, from the Nashville Elite Giants today.

Newsom, newly acquired Memphis hurler, went the route for the Sox, while the Giants used both Williams and White.

McHaskell celebrated his return to the Sox line-up by getting three singles out of five trips to the platter.

The visitors crossed the platter three times in the seventh stanza off Dean, the starting slinger for the Sox, and twice in the ninth off Bell, who relieved Dean. Willis toiled on the rubber for eight rounds, but had to have aid from White when the locals threatened to even the count.
